Spring 2024 Assistantship Applications Open




Each semester the School of Data Science awards on average 25-30 assistantships each semester to support SDS graduate and undergraduate academic programs. Assistantships are usually in one of two forms: Instructional Assistants or Teaching Assistants. Only students enrolled in an SDS program can apply for SDS-funded assistantships. Even if you currently hold an assistantship,

you must reapply to be considered for placement in spring 2024: <u>Apply Here</u>. More information can be found on your program website under "Current Students." Please make sure to read the eligibility requirements carefully. (*Faculty tend to seek students they know, students that have had success in their classes. Blanket emailing the faculty is not only inappropriate, it is also counterproductive.*)

Fall 2023 Graduation Information

Policy Update: Participation in Commencement Returns to Pre-Covid Policy

The Provost Office recently announced that they are reverting to the pre-Covid policy that limits student participation in a commencement ceremony within their term of graduation. In other words, the Provost Office will no longer allow students to delay their participation to a later semester for the ceremony.

Students must participate in a commencement ceremony within their term of graduation. Undergraduate students who wish to attend commencement must attend the ceremony within their college; graduate students (including certificates) who wish to attend commencement must attend the Graduate School ceremony. All students must have a valid UNC Charlotte ID or a government issued photo ID and their UNC Charlotte ID number to participate in commencement. - From the Provost website

DegreeWorks Audit: On Track To Graduate?

It may seem too early to be thinking about this, but graduation is closer than you think! Have you checked your transcripts lately to make sure all of your courses are counting towards your degree? **DegreeWorks** is a web-based planning tool that provides an accurate display of required coursework and helps students monitor their progress toward graduation. Students can access their real-time audit in DegreeWorks via **my.charlotte.edu** and should routinely check their progress toward degree completion.

Charlotte tech giant Tresata aims to stay ahead of the Al curve with the launch of the latest platform

Local startup Atom Power brings its EV charging system to Los Angeles entertainment district

From Charlotte Inno September 28, 2023: Huntersville-based startup Atom Power has made a deal with downtown Los Angeles' sports and entertainment district, L.A. Live, to install 48 of its electric vehicle-charging ports there. The transaction allows L.A. Live to more than triple its EV charger count that it has available on site. Its campus, which attracts nearly 20 million annual visitors, is equipped with a theater, museum, restaurants, and ballrooms, and it has hosted concerts and high-profile events such as the Grammy Awards. CMS to constrain the use of predictive technology in MA coverage decision

Rules created by the CMS to control the use of predictive technology tools by Medicare Advantage plans to anticipate patient care needs and inform coverage decisions go into effect on January 1. Meena Seshamani, who directs the Center for Medicare, said compliance with the new rules will be measured through audits, and enrollment suspensions or monetary penalties may be enforced to penalize insurers for noncompliance. **Full Story: KFF Health News (10/5)**

Al accelerates drug discovery process

Al is accelerating the process of discovering new therapeutic compounds and drug targets, enabling researchers to assemble protein structures from scratch thanks to the existence of an extensive protein database that has been decades in the making. Al is less effective in fields lacking comprehensive datasets, but scientists are working to develop generative Al systems that pull data from all the scientific literature in a given field to identify patterns, develop new hypotheses and plan and conduct experiments autonomously. **Full Story: National Public Radio (10/12)**

Seattle, WA | October 23 - 27


